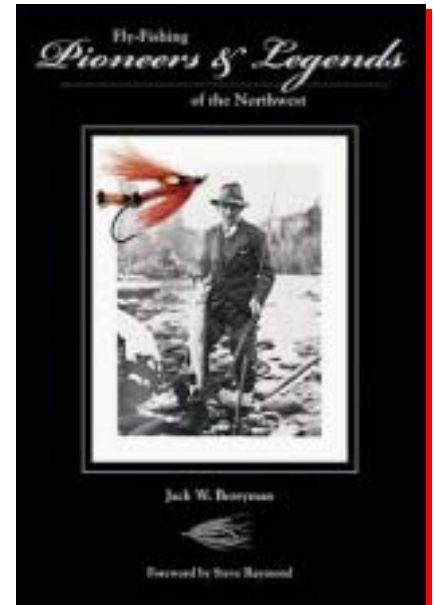

### Recipe:

Hook: #1-10 STLHD

Thread: Black

Tail: Red Hackle Fibers

Rib: Silver Tinsel

Body: Green or Red with Black Chenille

Hackle: Black Saddle

Wing: White Bucktail

### **Librarian's Corner By Jim Pankiewicz**

#### ***The Estuary Fly Fisher* By Steve Raymond**

At 92 pages this is a relatively short book and an easy read. Chapters in this book include: A taste of Salt, The Nature of Estuaries, Pacific Salmon in Northwest Estuaries, Trout and

Char in Northwest Estuaries, Marine Game fish in Northwest Estuaries, The Nature of Tides, Observations of Fish and Tides, So Many Estuaries, So Little Time, Tackle and Tactics, An Assortment of Estuary Fly Patterns.

There is technical information in this book but it is also mixed with Raymond's musings which I personally enjoy-- "In the estuaries there is a curious sense of both distance and intimacy, of silence and sound, of stillness and movement, all somehow conveying the feeling of a primal place, a place close to the origin of things."

Okay, who remembers this? For you old timers, on page 78 there is a small picture of Charlie Walkinshaw playing a Sea-Run Cutthroat in Hood Canal. His father is shown in the background photographing him. Sometime in the late 70's or early 80's Charlie's dad did a program for our club when we were meeting at the Elks. ## Fly Earrings By Reed Miller

Some of you have seen the fly earrings I make. I usually donate a couple of pairs for women's prizes at the Christmas party. Here is how I make them. HOOK: I like the Eagle Claw #202, a gold plated, Aberdeen bend, straight eye, long-shank hook. I don't know where to get them locally, but they are available in the Cabela's spring fishing catalog. I first bought them at Wal-Mart in Clarksville, TN.

You will also need the following, which are available at Craft Mart and probably other craft stores.

- 3mm gold colored beads.
- Earrings. I have both silver and gold plated brass ones. You can get real gold from jewelry supply stores. The ones I use have a loop that fits through the ear pierce hole.
- Zap-a-Gap glue.

Prepare your hooks by clipping off the point just ahead of the barb. Next, slide a 3mm bead over the barb so the remaining hook point is covered. Then, give it a small droplet of Zap-a-Gap.

When the glue has set, tie a pair of flies, whatever pattern you wish. I sell these, and Purple Peril is quite popular.

After the head cement is dry, you can mount the fly on the earring. Open the earring eye-loop with needle-nosed pliers and slide the hook on, making sure the hook point will hang towards the wearer when they put the earring on. Close the loop and the earring is finished
