**Gary Loomis to give CCA Presentation
to Fly Fishers**

Gary Loomis has been instrumental in bring the Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) to the Northwest. On Friday, January 18 at 7 p.m. at the Mt. Vernon P.U.D. building Gary will be giving a presentation on the CCA in the Northwest for fly fishers. What is the CCA you ask? The CCA began in 1977 after drastic commercial overfishing along the Texas coast decimated redbfish and speckled trout populations. Fourteen concerned recreational anglers created the Gulf Coast Conservation Association to combat commercial fishing excesses and conserve the resource. By 1985, Gulf-state chapters had formed from Texas to Florida. By decade's end, state chapters were founded through the mid-Atlantic region, and by the early '90s, development of the New England state chapters was completed. In 2007, Washington and Oregon opened CCA chapters. CCA has been active in virtually every national fisheries debate since 1984 and has participated productively in state and federal fisheries management issues for longer than two decades. CCA continues to operate as a three-tiered organization, affecting issues on the local, state and national levels. **YOUTH FLY FISHING SUMMER ACADEMY
– June 22-28, 2008**

The Washington Council Trout Unlimited and the Washington State Council - Federation of Fly Fishers jointly announce that applications are being accepted from youth, ages 12 to 16, to attend the annual Northwest Youth Conservation and Fly Fishing Academy. The Academy will be held from June 22 – 28, 2008 at the Gwinwood Conference Center on Hicks Lake in Lacey, Washington. It was established in 2004 to educate youths about the importance of natural resource conservation and stewardship, and to learn the basics of the sport of fly fishing. The weeklong summer event is modeled after the award winning Pennsylvania Rivers Conservation and Fly Fishing Youth Camp held annually in Boiling Springs, Pennsylvania. The Olympia Chapter Trout Unlimited and the South Sound Fly Fishers are the hosting organizations.

The curriculum is structured to provide students with a background in fundamental science and includes essons in ecology, hydrology, aquatic entomology, invasive species, watersheds, wildlife management, and fish behavior. Participants also learn the basic fly fishing skills that include fly casting, fly tying, fly selection, knot tying, reading water, water safety, streamside etiquette, and the "catch and release" ethic.

Twenty-four youths who show an interest in the outdoors and fly fishing will be selected to attend. The Academy is co-educational with acceptance based upon the candidate's written essay indicating his/her desire to attend and the expectations she/he hopes to learn from the camp. Total cost, including meals and lodging, for the event is \$275.

2008 Washington State Fly Fishing Conclave

The Washington State Council FFF is sponsoring their annual fly fishing conclave on May 3, 2008 at the Kittitas County Event Center (fairgrounds) in Ellensburg, Wa.

The exhibition hours are 8:30 am to 6 pm, at which time the banquet and live auction will begin. It will be an opportunity for all those interested in fly tying to share with the experts, exchange ideas, advance their knowledge, and have some fun. The Council and volunteers from Washington's many fly clubs and fly shops are providing the staffing for the fly tying, casting demonstrations, seminars, casting lessons and competitions. A silent auction will be conducted throughout the day with a variety of items.

The Conclave will continue with the fly tying demonstrations and exhibits that were very popular last year. Over 100 fly tyers will be demonstrating their special skills and flies. Classes will be available for those interested in starting or advancing their tying.

For 2008, the program has been expanded to include private and semi-private casting lessons from certified instructors with casting clinics for individual help. Some of the best casters in our state will attend and many pointers can be picked up just by their demonstration. There will be team distance and accuracy casting competitions, including the challenging Danish casting games. Classes will be available for those new to the sport, to learn the basic skills of fly fishing. The introductory fly fishing classes will touch on equipment selection, fly selection, the correct way to rig a fly rod, basic casting, on the water fishing and wading skills. One class will be taught by women for women only. Fourteen fly fishing seminars will be conducted by various experts. The evening will conclude with a western BBQ buffet banquet. A live auction presenting lots of fishing gear, an "Authors of the Northwest" fly plate and a WSCFFF "Affiliated Club" fly plate with flies tied by a member of each club, plus a fly rod built especially for the event by Fetha-Styx. The evening program will feature, Bob Jacklin, founder of Jacklin's Fly Shop in West Yellowstone, Montana. Bob is a member of the FFF Casting Board of Governors, he will share his insight and humor with attendees.

Northwest Fly Tyer and Fly Fishing Expo – 20th Anniversary. March 7th and 8th, 2008 in Albany, Oregon.

Location will be Linn County Fair and Expo Center.

A status report as of Mid December, 2007:

170 different tyers have registered to be here. (We expect 200 will be registered by end of December. There are several new faces this year which is exciting.)



31 different vendors occupying 40 booth spaces have registered. (We add space from last year for a total of 47 booth spaces.- so 7 booths are still available)

The entrepreneur village (a new area we are trying this year-7 available tables for the hobbyist – 3 have registered.)

Attached is the two spread sheet outlining the classes being offered this year. There is a total of 60 classes with room for more which the team is working to fill.

Live auction items are already being gathered: Wasatch tools – has donated a 32 wood inlayed tying tool set in a hand carved box – we have issue 1 of 4.

Six fishing trips have been donated and have promises of more.

Four art pieces – one is from Dave Allred (sculptor), Dave has donated some great art pieces for the National Conclave in 1980's because of health had to stop. He is now back and he will catch

WSCFFF Letter by Kevin Ryan

The following is a letter edited by Kevin Ryan, VP Conservation, WSCFFF. The letter was sent to Ellen Berggren, Study Manager for The Bureau of Reclamation in regards to the construction of the dam at Crab Creek. The letter was sent December, 2007. Mike Clancy, Secretary, WSCFFF

Dear Ms. Berggren:

I am the Conservation Vice President for the Washington State Council of the Federation of Fly Fishers. The Council represents 17 affiliated clubs throughout this state and over 750 members. The Federation represents thousands of similar minded outdoors people throughout the country. To the point, the Council, at its last meeting, voted unanimously to oppose, with every means at our disposal, the proposed inundation of Crab Creek. The Crab Creek valley at the Columbia is a superb and unique environment containing several of the best fishing lakes in the state and some of the best habitat for birds and wildlife in the Northwest. The Bureau and the Corps have flooded enough land in the last century. That must be the end of this prodigal behavior. In the future, sensible water policies must be adopted that emphasize water conservation and pricing that reflects the value of water. There isn't any "new water". What we have is it, as you well know. We understand that the cost of moving water to the Odessa Subarea may be up to \$33,000 per acre. This is an unacceptable expense to the tax and rate payers. and an unacceptable taking and loss to the thousands who are repeatedly enriched by the wonders of the Lower Crab Creek area, but whose enrichment diminishes the treasure not a penny for those who come later.
