2008 NW Youth Conservation and Fly Fishing Academy

There was no finer opportunity for 24 youth, ages 12-16, to learn about conservation and fly fishing than at this serious, no nonsense, five day fly fishing experience. Dick Nye, the founder of the Academy, has done an incredible job organizing this 100% volunteer event. The students bunked in cabins at the Gwinwood Conference Center on Hicks Lake in Lacey, Wa. along with their advisors. The June 22-28, 2008 event was sponsored by the Olympia Chapter of TU and the South Sound Fly Fishers of Olympia, Wa. Some students were sponsored by various fly fishing organizations throughout the State of Washington.

Carl Johnson, President of the Washington State Council FFF, along with Gary Kellog, President of the South Sound Fly Fishers, Ron Smorynski of the Olympia TU and Paul Sparks, Washington Council TU, were invited to speak at the Opening Ceremonies.

To develop the student's fly fishing skills, the 24 students were divided into eight groups rotating through the three skill development sessions in casting, fly tying and knot tying. Wake up was at 6am, with classes and various activities all day till lights out at 11pm. Groups were transported by volunteers to the local Dechutes River for evening fishing, while the others stayed back at camp to fish Hicks Lake, study, practice casting or tie flies.

The fly tying classes were conducted by Skip Morris, Janet Schimpf and Karen Royer, all well known and respected fly tyers. The curriculum is structured to provide students with a background in fundamental science and includes presentation on ecology, hydrology, aquatic entomology, invasive species, watersheds, wildlife management, and fish behavior. The students will also learn the essential fly fishing skills that include fly casting, fly tying, fly selection, stream side ethics and etiquette, knot tying, reading water and water safety.



Major contributors to the event were Cabela's, Sportsman's Warehouse, Outcast Sporting Gear and Office Max. The WSCFFF awarded each student with a one year youth membership to the Federation of FlyFishers.

Need an Extra Hand ? By Jesse Scott

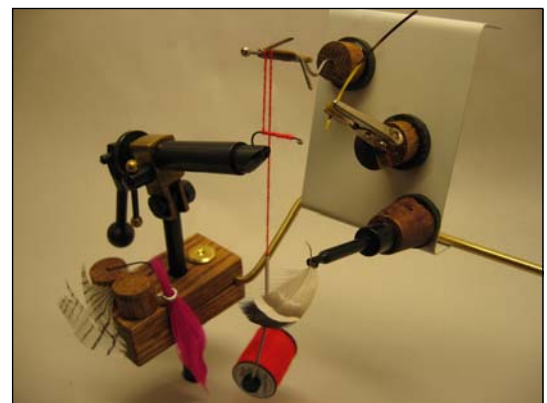
How about a one-handed fly tying tool you can build at home. It was developed by a

member of the Evergreen Fly Fishing Club and is called the Evergreen Hand.

The device attaches to the stem of a fly tying vise. It consists of 3 major parts, a two piece wooden block, a brass rod connecting arm, and a white metal plate. The wooden block clamps the connecting arm. This allows the connecting arm to swing in an arc in relation to the vise. Additionally, the metal plate rotates around the connecting arm with a wrist-like action. Any one of three "finger" tools can be positioned on the metal plate and are held by magnets. Two of the tools are for gripping things and the third tool is used to tie in tails. The wooden block has several additional features which can be used to prepare tying materials.

The wooden dowels rotate inward, cam like, against each other to hold material. The small metal eye is used to prepare marabou. There is also a cork disc on the end of one dowel to hold a hook so it can be grasped with one of the gripping tools and held in the vise while the jaws are closed.

It was designed to help a wounded soldier at Madigan Army Medical Center and it worked. The plan now is to make the information available on the EFFC website so others can build them.
