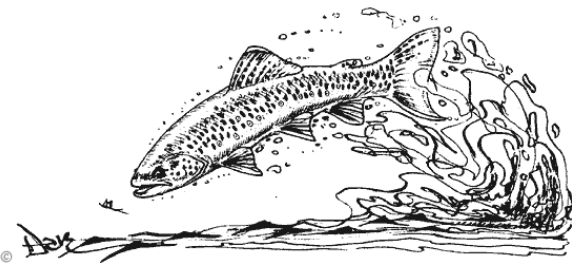

hatchery and provides technical advice to the tribal natural resource manager, fisheries director, and staff on fisheries enhancement issues.

Kip will give a presentation on the history of the Stillaguamish Watershed, our home river. He also has a presentation on the effects that global warming could have on the watershed and possible things we can do to counteract those things.

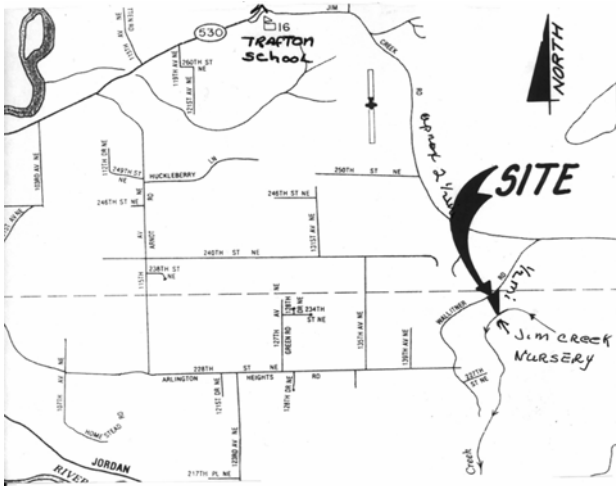
