Speaker for August By Rob Gamage

Our Speaker for this month is **Trapper Badovinac**. He comes to us from Montana with a presentation titled “**Unlocking the mysteries of fly fishing**”. This program will cover; reading riseforms, understanding feeding lies vs holding lies, the dynamics of moving water, analyzing and eliminating drag, refusals, the physics of playing a fish and unlocking other fish behavior mysteries.

Feed-back from others that have seen his presentations confirm that he is very entertaining!

The following is copied from his “Bio” that he sent me;

“Trapper Badovinac can't remember a time when he didn't love to fish. His father and grandfather taught him the sport when he was a preschooler, and he soon learned to appreciate the excitement only a mountain stream could deliver. Growing up in Canon City, Colorado, he fished the trout-plentiful Arkansas River and many other streams and lakes throughout the Centennial State. After high school, he served four years in the United States Navy and then attended California State University Sacramento, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Journalism.

After graduation, he worked as a professional photographer and graphic artist. In 1997 he began guiding on the Missouri, Smith and Blackfoot Rivers. He is lecturing on fly fishing and entomology, and his articles have been published in Fly Fisherman, Fly Rod & Reel, Northwest Fly Fishing, Southwest Fly Fishing, Montana Sporting Journal, divide magazine, Northwest Travel and Montana Magazine.

In May of 2003 he released his first book Fly Fishing Montana's Missouri River. His second book, Fly Fishing the Solitude–Montana, came off press in May 2006 and



follows the format of his Missouri River book with pragmatic advice coupled with beautiful photography and illustrations. This second book gives the reader a step-by-step guide to finding, evaluating, and fishing small western streams.

This well versed outdoorsman is a much sought after lecturer. He speaks to clubs all over the United States during the winter months. His presentations are professional, packed with "how to" information, and are illustrated with his award winning photography and computer graphics.

Trapper was a fly fishing guide for eleven years, nine of them on the Missouri, Smith, and Blackfoot rivers in Montana. He produces all his own flies and tied commercially for shops in Colorado and Montana. His expertise and innovative techniques are lauded in the fly fishing community.

He approaches angling with a laid-back philosophy. He assures that, in the sport of fly fishing, the right education and experience is more important than years of experience, and he believes it is a sport anyone can enjoy. "It's all about leaving your troubles behind," he says, "and enjoying the sport of fly fishing. It's a chance to immerse yourself in nature, and standing in a good trout stream testing your skills is a great way to give yourself a break from the sometimes-chaotic world we live in. This very simple and quiet sport can transform you by making your world one of simple pleasures." He lives in the woods outside Helena Montana."

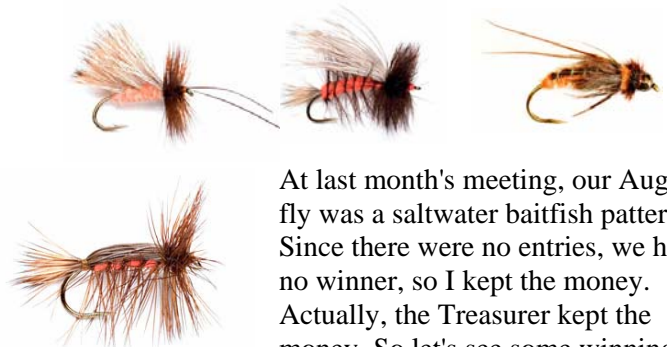

During the month of September is when we see the big orange caddis hatching off the rivers here in the western states. On the Deschutes, I've seen them range from dark orange to a tan or yellowish color and over 2 inches in length. During the recent invertebrate survey on Canyon Creek that Jesse Scott organized, a handful of these caddis larva were observed. There are some great patterns that mimic this insect, ranging from orange stimulators to foam-body patterns. Below are some photo examples. Let's see some orange flies this month!



At last month's meeting, our August fly was a saltwater baitfish pattern. Since there were no entries, we had no winner, so I kept the money. Actually, the Treasurer kept the money. So let's see some winning flies!
